## Natspec: who we are

Natspec is the membership association for organisations, including colleges and independent providers, which offer specialist further education and training provision for students with learning difficulties and/or disabilities.

## What we do: Purpose and activities

Natspec supports a diverse range of specialist further education and training provision for young people with learning difficulties or disabilities that broadens their choice, supports their aspirations, represents their best interests and provides a social return on investment.

Our core activities are that we:

1. **Support and inform our members to raise the quality of provision:** via guidance, briefings, [events](#), conferences and networks. We also help our members provide advice and guidance to [young people, their families](#) and supporters.
2. **Advocate for our members and influence policy:** via [representations](#) to government, funding agencies and other stakeholders, including through the use of [student voice](#). We promote the work of our members through our [directory](#), website, [e-newsletters](#), [social media](#) and publish blogs and articles to highlight the positive difference members can make to the lives of young people with SEND.
3. **Support the wider FE sector:** via training and development through [TechAbility](#) and the [Natspec Transform](#) service, together with projects and partnerships to support professionals throughout the sector. We provide opportunities for students to engage in inter-college activities such as [Inclusive Skills](#), the [Natspec Games](#) and the [Student Parliament](#). We also contribute to the work of other organisations who also seek to improve the lives of people with disabilities and promote them as valuable contributors to society.
4. **Develop our internal systems to ensure sustainability:** via our internal company infrastructure and systems for HR, finance, [memberships](#), technology and communications.

## Member colleges provide:

- ✓ Challenging but safe adult environments which encourage students to develop personally and socially
- ✓ Specialist multi-disciplinary teams with expertise in teaching, learning support, therapies and assistive technologies which enable students to learn effectively

- ✓ High quality, personalised Study Programmes linked to Education, Health and Care plans, which support students to achieve their aspirations for work or higher education; living more independently with greater choice and control; having friendships, supportive relationships and being involved in the community, and leading a healthy lifestyle
- ✓ Opportunities for students to develop their communication skills, express their views, and make choices and decisions

### **To promote continuing improvement and innovation, member colleges:**

- ✓ Work in partnership with students and their families, with other members, with other education and training providers, and with local and national agencies
- ✓ Ensure that staff are suitably experienced and qualified and have regular opportunities to update their professional practice.

As part of their Natspec membership, member colleges commit to:

- return requests from Natspec for information and data that will provide evidence for consultations and lobbying
- engage with Natspec activities as far as possible, and encourage staff members to attend relevant training and forum meetings
- avoid behaving in such a way as to bring Natspec into disrepute
- share their skills and strengths with other members to support improved quality of provision for all learners with learning difficulties and disabilities.

## Types of membership

There are two types of membership: Full membership and Natspec Transform.

### Natspec Membership is open to specialist FE providers only:

- ESFA funded Specialist Post 16 Institutions (SPIs) in England
- Specialist FE Colleges in Wales
- Equivalent organisations in Scotland and Northern Ireland
- Other organisations, including independent learning providers, which provide state-funded Further Education (post-school), and where the majority of the education provision has been established for students with learning difficulties and disabilities, and there are at least 10 high needs students with the provision named in their Education Health and Care Plans (EHCP).

All Natspec Members (Specialist providers) automatically also become members of Natspec Transform, but not vice versa. They have full voting rights according to the articles of association.

### Natspec Transform is our professional development, advice, support and training service

Membership of Transform gives you priority access and discounts on these services and is open to:

- Incorporated colleges: General FE Colleges, Sixth Form Colleges, Land based colleges, and specialist designated colleges: [details on the AoC website](#). Individual departments or specialist units of these colleges can also subscribe directly.
- Independent Learning Providers and Adult and Community Learning providers who are inspected by Ofsted and hold an ESFA contract.
- Other organisations who work in the FE sector with an interest in promoting the objectives of Natspec.

Individuals and freelance consultants can take advantage of some member benefits, including briefings and discounted training, for an annual fee. Contact Rita Buckley for details.
